

Do You Want To Play With Others? Rules For 2 or More Players

1. Select a player to keep score for the game. This player then takes one Scoresheet and writes down the names of the players.
2. If you are Player 1, turn all 16 Game Tiles over so that the sides with the animal pictures are face down. Place them off to the side of the game board (but not on it). Each Game Tile can be matched to a square on the board with the exact same picture. *You have 1 minute to match as many Game Tiles to their correct squares on the board as you can.*
3. When you are ready, flip the timer over. Then turn over and pick up any one Game Tile. Try to place it on its correct square as quickly as you can. Look carefully because many of the images may look alike.
4. Only after you have matched this first Game Tile to its square can you turn over the next Game Tile. And once you match the second Game Tile, you turn over and try to match the next Game Tile, and so on.
5. You keep playing until time runs out. Then count how many Game Tiles you have correctly placed on the board. The player keeping score will cross off the same number of your circles on the Scoresheet. For example, if you have made 3 matches during your turn, the scorekeeper should place an 'X' in three of your circles.
6. After your score has been recorded, your turn is over. Take the Game Tiles off the board, flip them over, and then mix all the Game Tiles very well so that Player 2 can start.
7. It is now the turn of Player 2, who plays the same way. After Player 2 is finished, it is the turn of Player 3, and so on.
8. Once all the players have finished their first turns, Player 1 plays again, followed by Player 2, and so on.
9. The **Winner of the Game** is the first player to get all of their circles crossed off.

GROWN-UPS CAN PLAY ALONG TOO!

Do you want to play along with the kids? It's easy. Just follow the general rules given above for the kids, but here's the catch: when it is your turn to play, you have only 30 seconds to see how many matches you can make (the one-minute timer is put away and the kids count to 30 before saying 'time's up'). Or if you wish to make it more challenging still, you might want to try playing with only 20 seconds. Once you decide on your time limit, you are ready to join in on the fun.
